lying next to timber north being parts of a flat of ground with the
tenement next to Hugh Drury and the said Henry proutie and joined to the
lands of the said Edmond Browne~~

Granted to Robert Beale twelve acres of upland lying on the west side
of the River being parts of a parcel of ground called Walnut tree hill

Granted to John Maynard one acre and a half of upland parted
from Sir Goufflot by the highway lying between the lands of
John Moore and Robert Darwill And also also an acre of upland
joining to the east end of the same acre & half now also acre
the said John Maynard bought of Robert Beale.

John Kutter bought of John Beale Sir Goufflot containing by estima-
tion six acres or thereabout lying between the Goufflot of John Moore
and the Goufflot formerly granted to widow Wite & now in the
possession of William Gow. And also an acre & half of upland parted
from the said Goufflot by the highway to the same more or less &
joining to the lands of John Wood now said parcel of an acre
an half. the said John Kutter sold unto John Crofts and now is
in the possession of the said John Crofts.

Granted to John Goodenow five acres of upland lying upon the
partly layne joining to the west side of the lands of the widow
Gunt and the west side south side butte upon the path that leads
to water tower

Mr Edmond Browne bought of Henry proutie five acres of upland
lying upon a parcel of land between Milbrooke and pinbrooke being
the second division of upland granted to Henry proutie & lying most
westerly of all the lotte upon that north of land and lying between the
lands of John Yarminter Junior and the meadows where Milbrooke
and pinbrooke meet. And also one acre of upland lying upon a flat
of land that joining to timber north & is parts of a parcel now by
tenement next to Henry proutie now acre of land is that now adjoining
to a parcel of land now the said Edmond Browne bought of Hugh Drury
