

It is ordered the 8th day of the 3rd month 1643
that whereas there was an order made the 4th day of the 1st month 1641 that no inhabitant shall take any strange Eggs to keep within the town upon forfeit of five shillings for every Egg that shall be taken in contrary to that order it is now again renewed and further agreed upon that if any Eggs shall be lodged within the town within one week after this day shall the party that lodged any such Eggs shall forfeit for every Egg so lodged within the town five shillings or found under the charge or custody of any inhabitant in the town then every Egg so found so that every charge of them shall pay for every Egg five shillings

It is ordered that every man shall drive out all his Eggs a mile from the great meadow and those that refuse so to do shall pay 10^s for every Egg.

It is ordered that every man that dwells within a mile of the great meadow.

It is ordered that every inhabitant in the town shall drive out all his Eggs every morning into the wood & when they come out from at night to see them shall up fast or else if they be about the street to rings and yokes from and for default hereof every default for every Egg shall forfeit four pence this order is to take effect within a week after this by me.

It is ordered the 20th of the 3rd month that all cattle shall goe into a keeper except it be working Cattle in the hand of the labor and for all cattle that shall be taken without a herdsman or keeper unless it be working cattle in the hand of the labor shall forfeit four pence for every head. It is further agreed that this order shall stand in force till some other order be taken.

It is agreed by the town the 2nd of the 4th month that all the cattle of the town at night shall pay 10^s for every head.
