

April 23rd 1644

It is ordered that all forrins rattle that are taken in by any man
either for winter or summer shall be lyable to pay at to all towne
rattle that is for towne rattle & they are to be rated in the same
way & value as the towne rattle are.

It is ordered that all eggs that shall after the 6th day of this present month
be taken in any garden planted field or meadowes without peales and
rings & shall forfeite for every egg that is defective twelvedenies
this order takes hold only of hogg that are kept at home & not guarded out

June 25th 1644

The towne hath granted to walter haynes liberty to look out ten acres of upland
to dispose of to his forsaunt Burgard Widdow when his tyme is out.

December the 16th 1644 It is ordered that whosoever after this day shall cut
any timber upon the common without leave either from Mr. Wor. or Edmund
Goodnow shall forfeite for every tree soe fallen myntene shillings and all for
Edmond Goodnow is appointed to see to all defects & to cause the perfects
to be made for his labor & the rest is to goe to the towne use.

January the 24th 1644 It is agreed that wheresoever Ragn & his family
shall have any woods of meadow next adjoining to his then addition of
upland at gravelle pitte that shall be made & removed & procuring more
in quantity than his first area it is granted that he shall have it
all without contradiction as it may or less be made before he
shall be upland at gravelle pitte and his meadow land shal be John
Goodnow his forsaunt division of meadow.

John Cole is appointed to make record the marriage of his son
after the 24th day of January 1644 & to be paid for
his labor six shillings & six pence.

Granted to Edmond Goodnow to run with his fence at the end of his land
upon the hill & road on end towards the common to answer his fence of
John Cole & John haynes.

~~Granted to John Cole to take in a little parcel of land lying at
the West end of his land & to be paid for his labor & to be paid for his labor
the rest is to be his forsaunt the land of his wife & his wife
the land lying to his forsaunt.~~

Granted to William Lacey liberty to fence his meadow at his forsaunt
to run his fence from the river to his upland & to be paid for his labor
the rest is to be his forsaunt the land of his wife & his wife
