It is ordered by the town that William Brown and John Wood
have power to call out men to the mending of the high wayes.
and are chosen furriers for one year after this day. ~~and the~~
~~to the furrier rate. now appointed till the rate be perfected.~~ and the
way by w^{ch} men shall work it according to the estate that men
have and the invoice of men's estate to be taken once a year for the
knowing & survey man's due.

John Blandford & Hugh Griffyn are appointed to have the oversight of the
meadows & to see the order executed which was made against cattle running
into the great meadows upon penalty of fine for every desert of the garden
for letting the great road in & 6^d a head for every beast kept round in by
the owner's desert. w^{ch} order was made the 1st of May 1642 and they
shall have all the forfeite for their labor.

Edmond And & Hugh Griffyn are appointed to assist Mr. William in the laying
out of the third addition of meadow & the town duly agreed w^{ch} they to pay
them for laying out the said meadows a penny for every acre.

Mr. Mayor hath liberty given him to take up so much land upon the
point of the said land on the west side of the River lying to the
meadows at May with consideration to be done. w^{ch} out provided to the
high way w^{ch} goes to the inland meadows.

June the 24th 1645 At it is agreed by the town that those men that
that have a 3^d addition of meadow shall attend the laying out
being warned reasonably and those that shall be defaulting in attending
to take it out either themselves or some body for them shall pay to
the furriers 3^d an acre for laying out & staking it.
It is also agreed that no man shall ^{move} any of the town's meadow after
within ten days shall pay if any man shall transgress so shall
pay for every desert 2^d an acre.
