the town to order the town affairs from this day forward
for one year.

September the 29th 1645 It is ordered that the owners of every field
shall have liberty to put in their rattle for the space of 10 days after
the field is first broken And after the 10 days be expired whatsoever
rattle comes open road & desert of about a year shall pay
6^d for every bush & every rattle & Egg that shall be taken in after
the time expired shall pay 3^d apiece for every one. If they that after the
space of the 10 days shall be taken upon any English road shall be
liable to pay the forfeit.

It is also ordered that within 10 days after the breaking up of the fields
that every man shall make up his fence w^{ch} belongs to any general field
where and to make it sufficient according to the judgment of the
surveyors & after the time of 10 days expired whatsoever shall have his
fence defective shall pay for every rod defective 12^d and the surveyors
shall have the forfeit of the field in the South West and

November the 1st 1645 It is ordered that all those who are accounted
to have seats ^{in the meetings} that they shall bring in their ^{first} payment for their seats
to Hugh Griffyn or agree wth him between this and the 1st day of the
month ^{next week} and those that are defective w^{ch} do hereby give power to the
marshall to distress both for their payment for their seats and also for
the marshall's own labour according to a former order 12^d.
