Granted to Edmond Goodnow for his service done at the Court by award
of upland & fine acres of meadows the meadows lying between the first
division of meadows of John Pudduck & the second division granted to Joseph Tuziter
Also granted to William Browne a small quantity of upland lying
to his house & house lot now was formerly thought to be not part of his
property & lay between his house & the high way going to the bridge
& containing a quarter of an acre or there about,

December the 11th 1645 It is ordered that whatsoever
timber lay upon the common ^{whether risen or not risen} that hath bene fallen about
Bretels the owners shall have power to take it away within
a fortnight after this day and whatsoever shall after be found
shall be at the towns disposal.

It is also ordered that Edmond Goodnow shall in the behalf
of the town see to the preservation of the timber of the
common & take every man his liberty to appoint to men
what timber they shall fall and shall give wth them to
appoint what trees and where they shall fall them by paying
him for his labor and so is also appointed to take
up all the timber that shall be forfeited wth is fallen
upon the common by the order above specified to make
use of it the one half for himself the other half for the
towns use and whatsoever shall fall any tree wthout
leave shall forfeit for every tree 19^s according to a former
order.

It is also granted to Mr. Browne the pastor that he shall
take up four acres of meadows where it may be convenient
in satisfaction for that wth was taken out of his first division
of meadows for a high way at the bridge end. The grant is given
in the pasture meadows or else where.
