Also granted to Richard Sanger Esq. an acre of upland on the
about not prejudicial to the highway lying between the house of
John Parmenter senior & John Goodenow & the land of William Sanger
if he shall set up his shop there.

Also how real liberty granted to John Pudduck William Sanger
to take up Esq. an acre of upland next to his house William Wards
upon the common provided he pay for the same
money of some other man's property in the same
common & lay it down into the town land.

It is also ordered by day and year above written that the third
division of meadow shall be lay out according to the first beginning
by lot every man to have his due according as it doth fall out
whether good or bad and those that have bad meadows shall have
allowance according to the direction of the surveyors & Walter
Layme & Edmund Pudduck who are appointed to go with the surveyors
to direct them in the way to go.
