

May 15th 26th 1646 It is agreed by the consent of the town
that the pastor shall have forty pound for his maintenance for this year
beginning the first of may last and that he shall have the one half of his
payment in all or some of the commodities spoken of herein that is in money
wheat peas butter eggs yokes beefe ^{for himself & family} and that he shall be paid at every
quarter and.

It is also ordered that Edmund Goodenow & Hugh Griffen shall lay
out to the widdow Calbrad for more land as is taken out of
the land w^{ch} w^{as} pond loton & Edmund Goodenow layd out about
the mill for Ensigne Calbrad. w^{ch} land w^{as} taken out for enlargment
of the river waye or by w^{ch} the fence of Thomas Brownes second
division of upland.
Also it is granted to William Brown that he shall quietly
enjoy the upland w^{ch} he hath now fenced in: w^{ch} is the second
division of upland formerly granted to Thomas Brown

It is also ordered that John Moore John Freeman & Hugh Griffen
shall take an increase as soon as may be for the gatherings of the
pastor rate for w^{ch} John Moore & John Freeman shall have three
shillinge hundred apiece and they are to appoynt Hugh Griffen his
wages.

~~It is also ordered that all transient cattle shalbe lyable to pay to
all rates and that cattle that are taken in for three years shal pay
to the full value of them as the townes cattle and other transient
cattle according to the value they are taken in shal be rated
for so much as they have for so long term.~~

Granted to Mr Philmon whole an acre & a half of upland lying
between the new dwelling house of Philmon whole and the
river way leading to the farms.

Granted to Henry Kirk an acre of upland adjoining to his barn

Granted to Edmund Goodenow liberty to runne the fence of his
garden on a straight line from Thomas Griffens fence to the gate
before the house of the said Edmund Goodenow.

The former order that is crossed was repealed at the same time that
it was made

It is ordered that Edmund Goodenow shall enjoy in rayntree wellhamstead
to lay out the third division of meadow
