ward John freedom & William Burrows to goe with Edmond
Goodenore & Hugh Griffen to see the severall lande layd out &
bounded & those men whose lande are layd out already if they repaire
to William ward John freedom & William Burrows it shall be altered
if they see reason accordinge to their direction

Thomas Goodenore & Robert Darvill are chosen for day & year
about written and chosen furthmore for the eight way for one year

Granted to Hugh Griffen a parcell of meadow containinge a acre & half
in the lower end of the brooke a little below the cart way that goeth over
to Rudge meadow in satisfaction for the eight way that goeth over
his first division of meadow from the bridge to the upland on
the west side of the brooke

Also to John Horro an acre for the same eight way

Also to Thomas White two acres for the same eight way

Also to William Corley junior one acre for the same eight way

Also to John Wlandford one acre for the same eight way

Also to John Moore one acre and more then what was formerly
granted him for satisfaction for the same eight way.

It is also ordered that all the eggs that are kept w^{ch} in this town bounds
shall be sufficiently ringed from the next first day of the first moneth
untill the last day of the next moneth next followinge and whosoever
shall finde any eggs defective shall give of the owner of such eggs
for every egg defective & for every time when any egg is so
taken all other orders formerly made about eggs & fowls stand in
force notwithstandinge.
