

December the 14th 1646 the towne granted liberty to walter
haynes to run a fence from his meadows with bys on the west side
of the River a most by the way to his house of his vylard at
his own dwellinge house provided that walter haynes do set a gate
at east side of his meadow for the passage of cartt & his goods
alonge the high way that his fence may not be prejudiciall to the
towne

walter haynes is appointed to grant timber to them that wante
on the west side of the River

Granted to John haynes four acre of vylard on the west side of
the River on the north side of Thomas Noys his land betweene that
& the high way going by the meadows

Granted to William Earley liberty to take of what he may not already
taken in of the pasture and of vylard due for the third division of
vylard of Joseph Byrton where he can finde it convenient

December the 21st 1646 It is ordered that noe oake timber
shall be fallen without leave from those that are appointed
by the towne to give leave to fell timber (that shall be about
eighteen a ymest about at the butt end and if any shall fall
any oake timber about eighteen ymest about at the butt then
they shall be lyable to pay mynutenes shilling a tree according
to a former order if for so many trees as are fallen without
leave.

It is also ordered that whosoever walter haynes & Edmond Goodenowe
are appointed by the towne to see to the preservation of the
timber of the towne & to give leave to men to fell their tim-
ber for their use that they shall have for every tree that is fallen
contrary to the towne order fynd shilling out of every forfeitt
for every tree so fallen
