It is ordered that all forraigne cattle that are taken in by any man
either for winter or summer shall be liable to pay to all Towne rates & to
be valued at the Towne rates according to an order formerly made in the
3rd of April 1644 which order is also hereby renewed & further confirmed.

It is also ordered that all men that have land formerly granted whether it be
laid out or not laid out if it be not recorded the surveyor shall have liberty
to lay it out in another place if the owners of the land have not made
any use of that land formerly granted and that the lands that shall
hereafter be laid out shall be recorded for good as it is laid out.

Walter Haynes hath liberty to lay downe twenty acres of land formerly granted
him by the first of June made on the west side of the River & to take it up
elsewhere if he can find it convenient.
