particularly appointed for their side Also to judge of the sufficiency

It is also ordered by the select men that every person that shall be found of
any man out of his own propriety without a sufficient work or ring
after the said day the owner of such farm for taken shall pay treble
for every out of the said farm he yealed & not ringed or ringed & not
yealed then to pay six pence for every farm for taken besides all the
damages done by any such farm this order in respect of yealings to be
in force until next Indian harvest but in case of ringing continually
the further order be taken & this order in respect of yealings to be
in force from the 14th day of May & from hence till Indian harvest
when the said order shall be taken & the said order shall be first for the
23 Day of May 1654 It is ordered by the town

in a town meeting that from hence shall be power
given to the constable by warrant to distrain all rates that
are due to the town that are not paid due shall not be
paid in due season after due warning given to them
that hereby the town debt may be paid

It is further agreed by the town that Eugene Christy in the behalf
of the town shall have power to send out warrants to the
constable to distrain those that are behind in rates
arroungs to the town the of this order

It is also ordered that the constable Goodenow John Moor
& Thomas King shall have power to agree with some body to fill the walls
of the meeting house with timbered & provided for
