

Robert Gay me gave lured by bondfitt of by grass in
Strawberry Hill meadows all but four acres by the summe of it
to pay by town first shillings by 29th of September next
Also John parmiter sold gave lured by bondfitt of by grass
in the common meadows by the by in by gulph w^{ch} was formerly
granted to by pastor to pay by shillings sixpence to by
to rent at Michaelmas September 29th next sufficient

Also Thomas Gayme gave lured by common meadows in long
meadows by the summe of it to pay by shillings to by town
by 29th of September next.

Euge Cariffyn gave lured by pasture of common meadows
lying between the allowances of Mr. May of John Goodenow
of William 2nd Baron in the meadows for the summe of it to
pay by two shillings for the 29th of September 1654

It is also further agreed by by town of Edmund Goodenow
that Edmund Goodenow shall have the meadows w^{ch} he gave
lured w^{ch} in two years after with the bargain it to be void.

Also that John Hubbard shall of 2nd of the shall
have the meadows w^{ch} he gave lured w^{ch} in two years or
after the bargain it to be void.

By 16th day of June 1654 by a public town meeting
named for examination of the records of land belonging to by
town granted w^{ch} being that fully returned at by the
body first of last respecting by to be granted to by the
town publicly read & approved of by upon the town did order
that every inhabitant should have liberty to request to Euge
Cariffyn or town clerk who upon by request shall within
next day's space give by a true copy of the records of
the land abovesaid recorded in the town books under the
hand w^{ch} shall be a current title by paying the clerk
for his labor.

Also it ordered that the surveyor of land w^{ch} are appropriated
to lay out the town land shall lay out 50 acres of upland
about the meadows brook about the east gate by the gate and
the brook to be reserved for the use of by town to sett a mill
upon the brook & by are not to lay it out for any other use
whatsoever

By 4th of September 1654 by town order that every inhabitant should give from the day
forward for every by the w^{ch} in by points of by town one shilling sixpence for
every by & every woodpile a penny

It is ordered by the town that the select men shall give warrant
to the constable to distrain any that are behind in by any rate
already charged by the town to pay by town debt or any rate that shall be
charged within the year by select men stand if it be not paid upon demand
made by the town or by the select men
