January the 15th 1654 was the select men whose names are hereunto subscribed
considering the righteousness of the act in signing all the common lands that for
the five miles square first granted to Sudbury. & considering that we are necessarily
called to sign the same for the discovery of the same. Doo hereby order for the signing of all the common
lands where the said grant of the five miles square. That the inhabitants that
have liberty to pull upon the said common lands for feeding for every five acres of
meadows now is either of the first second or third divisions of meadows or grasslands
either freely given or sold or granted to men for some service done by them, or
free meadows as are granted under the name of alienation for every five acres
of meadows and grass that is either now or shall be or given about a year or
and every five or more about a year or to goe at and least a half a year
before to goe for one house & that all also under a year shall goe in the signing
until some further reason doo appear for signing them.
