

At a town meeting the 1st day of January 1658 by a ioynt consent of the town of Sudbury Henry Wiro was voted a free towns man this in consideration of the commissioners art in the year 1639 and also from the Towns atturnders in laying out the following divisions of land to him the sayd Henry Wiro as to others

Also the day and yeare above written John Rutter and John Riddat of Sudbury by a ioynt vote of the inhabitants of the Town of were made free Towns men this the Town did in consideration of their the sayd John Rutter and John Riddats being antient inhabitants as also in gratification of the honowred committe in the year 1655 maior willard m^r Thomas Danforth and Esq^r John Shearman

Also voted in the Town meetings the day and yeare above written and ioyntly agreede that the firvayors of Embor shall grant noo timber to any men but unto thos who are upon the town booke in records as Towns men reputed or have some of the town rights by vertue of purchase gift or grant from this last vote consented

At a town meeting the 3rd day of february 1659 voted and granted to peter Bent a certain parcell of upland at lanham in the east side of his house and also where his house stands being about an acre and being five rods wide at the south and running along the head of his land running to nothings at the north and he the sayd peter Bent payme twenty shillings in sorn to the Town of Sudbury when they demand it for full satisfaction for the sayd area of land the sayd sorn is payd
Also granted the 3rd day of february 1659 to Thomas Read of lanham seventy rods of land at the east end of his land and house at lanham as now it is stated and layed out by his wife Edmund Goodenow and Thomas Noyes he the sayd Thomas Read payme ten shillings in sorn to the Town of Sudbury when they demand it the sayd sorn is payd from this last vote and grant William

Also granted to mather Gibs the day and yeare last above written a small parcell of land containing more forty rods at the east end of his land at lanham this land stated according to the Towns apoyntment by his wife Goodenow and Thomas Noyes
