

A list of the names of the persons who are owners of the two miles granted to Sudbury in the year 1649 as the lots were drawn by a ioynt consent of the town of Sudbury the 4th of January 1657 and layd out the following year according to the town of Sudbury's order and agreement the 4th of January 1657 that is to say beginning at the fourt east angle and for along to the north east and for round the sayd excepting England as was demised to his ways in the sayd tract of land and all for except three hundred and thirty acres more was demised to my william Thronen for his term granted by the Court and one hundred and thirty acres of the sayd three hundred and thirty for the lot and portion from the town of Sudbury where three hundred and thirty layd out in the north west angle of the sayd demised tract beyond as before

These thirteen lots and a part above written are the second squadron the first whereof being William Ward who ioyntly to Lancaster and High way on the south the last being parts of the first and second lot which ioyntly to the second line on the north all the squadron of lots with the other above going being bounded on the east with a High way thirty rods wide and the five miles first granted the town of Sudbury one to the west with a High way thirty rods wide and part of the two miles last granted to Sudbury one lot containing one hundred and thirty acres. Third squadron and as followeth in the other side of the leaf
