

february the 7th 1659 we the folow men of Sudbury whos names
are under writen findinge sundry inconueniencs by reason of bad and ill
eige ways not being passable to medow lands and other towns and finding
the law doth commit the flabinge of eige ways to the discretion of
the folow men of towns we therfore being met the day and yeare
about written on parpors to view the eige ways in the west hyde
of Sudbury river and having taken paynes to view the same doo we say
conclude and joyntly agree that the eige way from the gravill pits
shall goe through the lands newly purchased of goodman mears to that
end and for to goe the land newly purchased of lieutenant goodenow
to that end and from thence down the brow of the hill the now
passed eige way unto the place where the new mill is buildinge
that is to say the way that is now in occupation we meane the
way that goeth at the foule end of m^r baillivys his founte and we
conclude that the sayd eige way shall be six rods wide at the
narrowest places and for all the way from the sayd gravill pits
unto the place where the new mill is buildinge, and where as at
the brow of the hill aforesayd at the end of m^r baillivys his founte
we conclude and joyntly agree that the way to the medows as namely
the medow of John great widdow goodenow John maynes and
lieutenant goodenow shall goe as now it doth that is to say in the
valley to the sayd medows the eige way to be six rods wide
all along by the hyde of the sayd medows.

Altho we the folow men receiving the necessity of a convenient eige way unto
the woods to the north west ward in the west hyde of the river between
the dwelling houses of Thomas noyes and the house of Thomas Holmston
we do say the folow men viewing the sayd way in to the woods at the
way to pauntroy and finding the improved land of Thomas Holmston the
land of John Chlambord and the land of Thomas noyes covening to gather in
the now passed eige way that now passeth can be to the pauntroy medows
withour yet into the woods the proprietors improvinge doo the for
order conclude and agree that the new flabed eige way shall begin
at the foule west angle of the yeard of the sayd Thomas noyes
(where the sayd yeard coveneth to his overgarden) and from thence as neare as
may be upon a straight line through the lands of the sayd Thomas
noyes and so through the middle of a little piece of medow where the
sayd Thomas noyes do get of Solomon Torson senior and from thence
upon a straight line to the north east angle of Thomas Holmstons
shall the way we joyntly conclude shall be six rods wide all through
out our boundes in the most convenient places to the inhabitants
lands and medows
