

All a Town meetings the 19 of maye 1660 William ward Siffenant Goodenow
Deron parmenter John Butcher Thomas Moyes Thomas Kings and John Grount
were chosen solert men for this followinge yeare to order by gradualall
affayres of the Town of Sudbury

Also the day and yeare above written Siffenant Goodenow John Grount and
John Butcher are chosen to rune the bounds with watertown men
in the begining of aprell to begin at the north east angle and from
thence to the southe east angle of our bounds, and from thence to
Sudbury river also the day and yeare above written John Gains
and William Moors are chosen to rune our bounds with sonsond
men begininge at our north east angle and soe to rune with
sonsond men to our north west angle quite through our bounds
our northerly line

Also the day and yeare above written John Studenok is chosen to carry
down the votes for the nomination of maiestrats

Also voted in the Town meetings the day and yeare first above written
and approved as authenticke the Town of Sudbury ^{grant} to Edmund
Goodenow of eight rods further upon pine hill about his now dwellings
Esus that his house maye crange over with the house of John Coll
and John Gains as in the grant in the yeare 1644 more playnly
appeareth

Also voted in the Town meetings the day and yeare first above written And
granted that the widdow Gunt shall have twenty five shillings for the
halfe yeare last past

Also voted in the Town meeting the day and yeare first above written
and granted liberty to Robert Darvill to take eitherall or a parte
of his land where he conveniently finds it in lieu of that
land where the hige way doe goe through that leadeth to the new
mill that is to say that what land the sayd Robert Darvill hath in
the west side of Sudbury river neare the indian bridge that he
sayd way doth pass through the sayd Robert Darvill hath liberty
to lay down to the towne as shew all or a parte and what
he the sayd Robert Darvill shall lay down he hath liberty to take
up so much in lieu thereof againe in the west side of
Sudbury river in any lands undisposed of

Also voted and granted liberty to Thomas Moyes the day and yeare first
above written to take any for musy land and meadow any where
in lands and meadows not yett layd out to gentles or men
as is taken from his land by a hige way layd out to the countrey
meadows by the solert men of Sudbury in the yeare 1659
Siffenant Goodenow and John Grount is to see the land and meadow
measured whiche was taken from the lands and meadows of Thomas
Moyes and to see that he have for musy measured to him
again in lieu of the sayd meadows and land taken off +
