

September 9 - 1661

At a town meeting the day and yeare above written voted and granted that the family Thomas Dimon shall have the meadow formerly granted to Richard Ganger and also six acres of upland in the southeast side of the way between Smithfield and forgotten Durdurks in consideration that the said Thomas Dimon shall honestly and carefully doe the town of Sudbury's smithery works the six years next ensuing this date in the town of Sudbury aforesaid from this vote Robert Dewell and John Mainer Deacons

Also voted in the aforesaid Town meetings and granted that it shall be in the liberty of the said Thomas Dimon to take the said six acres of upland when at the aforesaid place betwixt Smithfield and forgotten Durdurks or in the north side of the way beyond millbrook where said land was shown him by forgotten Grant always provided that the said Dimon shall dwell in the town of Sudbury and faithfully doe the town of Sudbury's smithery works the six years next ensuing this date the said Dimon's note excepting his former grant is accepted.

February the 17 - 1661

At a town meeting the day and yeare last above written voted and granted that Thomas Noyes shall record the new grant as namely the two miles last granted to the town of Sudbury in the books of records every inhabitant lands to be recorded with his own former records the number of the lot and the square with the persons and ways adjoining, only not to record the lands of forgotten Grant with the word more or less.

February the 17 - 1661 Deacon John Mainer lieutenant Edmund Goodenow Thomas Noyes John Grant William Whall & Thomas Mair John Maynard are chosen eldest men to order the prudentiall affairs of the town for the following yeare

February 17 - 1661 lieutenant Edmund Goodenow forgotten John Grant and Thomas Noyes are chosen commissioners to end small causes in Sudbury this following yeare.

February 17 - 1661 Thomas Noyes is chosen Town clerk for the following yeare and Peter King is chosen with Thomas Noyes to take the moneys for the yeares rates and other town rates voted in the Town meetings the day and yeare above written that the moneys shall be taken as formerly it was.
