voted and appointed that Thomas noyes shall pay the Town of Sudbury five shillings and receive the same sum of Thomas Whistler of Concord for 85 he paid whistlers offcom and trespass in cutting and raving away of the norwest corner of our bounds

February 17 - 1661

voted in the town meetings the day and year above written that John mainor shall and is hereby empowered in william wends place to look to the timber and wood in the norh east quarter of our town of Sudbury that noe stripes and wast be made and also to give leave to persons that want timber to fell timber provided so as according to former order

February 17 - 1661

voted in the town meetings the day above written that Wiltson and Goodenow shall and is hereby empowered in Thomas Goodenow place to look to the timber and wood in the east and south east quarter of our town of Sudbury that noe stripes and wast be made and also to give leave to persons that want timber to fell timber provided so as according to former order

April 22 - 1662

At a town meeting the day and year last above written granted liberty to Thomas noyes to lay down 85 great lot in the two miles last granted the Town of Sudbury wherby say given lot contain one hundred and thirty acres of land and is the second lot laying neare Doofrine hill having the land of John Blanford one the forty and the land of walter Gains on the north also granted liberty to the above said Thomas noyes to take one hundred and thirty acres of land lying to the south at Soufodall in line of the one hundred and thirty the laid down Wiltson and Goodenow and forgot John Givout and in account to for it laid out to the said Thomas noyes also voted the day and year last above written that the Town of Sudbury will keep the sayd one hundred and thirty acres of land wherby the said Thomas noyes did lay down at Doofrine with to be a publick store of timber for the use of the Town also voted that noe inhabitant of Sudbury what soever shall fell any tree or trees what so ever growing upon the sayd one hundred and thirty acres at Doofrine. till the year next generally of the forfeiture of minerva shillings a tree to the Town of Sudbury except such as he have leave in a publick town meeting warned for that purpose
