

February the 16th 1662

At above meetings the day and yeare a bond written the sayd meeting being
warned by tith of february at a lecture by the Clarke the busines then spoken
and all written and set upon the dore of the meeting house where businnes
were for the Choise of select men and also to choos a constable to choos
a man or men to take an inwaite to put the tith ways in this our
town of Sudbury in a posture that they may be made up as also to
give answer to John Spier Josiah Gams Thomas Glymston whether or
no the town of Sudbury will give them leave and liberty to lay down
their suggestiours of land in the west syd of the river upon the
grasse playn over right bridell ground and take it other where.

The effects of the meeting are as followeth the town making being full
Leifland Goodenow Thomas Noyes Solomon Whall Sergeant
John Herout in Josias Noyes Thomas Dine Golder Noyes were
chosen select men to order the gravenall affaires of the town
of Sudbury for this following yeare also Thomas Dine was
chosen constable the day and yeare first above written
also John Grommenter Doremore was chosen to goe with Thomas Noyes
this present february to take an inwaite for the grasses waste
and the saw way take

Also voted and granted the day and yeare first above written that the saw
way by the gravill pit and also the spine of saw way by the great river
bridge shall be sufficiently made up as he other was last yeare with
faggots and gravill at or before the twenty fourth of June next
in June this date and also that those that make that parte of the
saw way next the gravill pits shall make as many againe as they
that make their parts by the bridge, from his own name Doremore
Also voted and granted that he now above chosen select men are chosen
and may now a cometh (with the same power the saw way Comith) had
the last yeare for to make up the saw way to model stake
and proportion every inhabitant his just proportion in the sayd
spine of saw way which is to be made up according to their inwaite
which shall now be taken by Thomas Noyes and Sergeant Grommenter
Also voted and granted that there shall be a list road of every inhabitant
measur and a lot drawn when his name is read and that who soever
draws the first lot shall begin at the gravill pit and goe fiftieth lot
to end at the bridge and so to follow successively from the gravill
pit which is the first to the bridge which is the fiftieth
road and respect being had by the Comith to every one to his
proportion every on his just part according to form or order
Also at the same instant every inhabitant drew his lot and was at
present ordered by the Clarke
