

1641 The inhabitants of Sudbury granted to Mr Henry Dunstar a
of upland & meadowe by estimation four frow acres or there about
the same more or less lying in the southe pt of the town & bound
of 100 royming to the North side of Mrs Dunstar farms granted to
her by the country & butting upon a piece of meadowe that the
inhabitants of Sudbury gave to Mrs Dunstar (w^{ch} meadowe lyeth
on the north west of it) & royming to the south side of certain land
w^{ch} Mr Dunstar bought of sundry of the inhabitants of Sudbury
& the east side of it extending to the fence that is now made

Laid out to Mr Edmund Brown being formerly granted him for
his third division of upland & meadowe fifty five acres of
upland & twenty five acres of meadowe lying in the south west
part of the bound of Sudbury w^{ch} upland & meadowe royming
together towards the west side of the upland. the upland is cut
from the meadowe commonly called the west meadowe by the high
way. And from thence runs southward having a little gutter of
meadowe in it next to the east side of it & westward royming
to the said twenty five acres of meadowe only four acres of the
said upland lyeth royming to the North pt of the twenty five
acres of meadowe between the meadowe & the high way. And
the twenty five acres of meadowe is bounded at the west end
with three white oaks marked and answered to a line.

Laid out to Walter Hayme five acres of meadowe being a pt
of his third division of meadowe for the same more or less
lying on the west side of the line next to the meadowe of
the said Walter Hayme called flage meadowe & lyeth next to
the high way that leads to Walter Haymes painted meadowe
Also four acres of meadowe laid out to Walter Hayme & the
same more or less lying in the high meadowe next adjoining to
the meadowe of John Moores & the same more or less which
was granted to him for allowance to his third division of
meadowe

The two acres of meadowe last above specified the said Walter
Hayme gave to Solomon Johnson & the said Solomon Johnson
gave unto Hugh Griffin & now is in the possession of the said
Hugh Griffin

Laid out to Robert Dacull being the third division of meadowe
due to said Dacull lying in the painted meadowe between the
three quarters w^{ch} he had to be laid out lying
on the west of the meadowe of William Dacull granted to
Solomon Johnson it fell short of six acres for he had all the meadowe
from William Brown for it more or less to the west end of
the meadowe was granted to the said Robert Dacull & for
further satisfaction to said Dacull there was given to him in a
meadowe in the north pt of the town & bound in a meadowe
lyeth westward from the painted and also four acres of
lying in the north end of Strawberry & meadowe
