

Also granted to Robert Darrell eighteene acres of a litle of upland
upon yppre playne neere to grentes road lying between the lands
of Edmund the said lands granted to John Freeman
Also granted to Robert Darrell fyve acres of meadowe lying at
yppre brooke southward from the meadowe of Edmund Goodenowes
Northward from the highway between Sudbury & Watertown.

1651 Laid out unto William Brown sixty seven acres of upland
and twenty acres of meadowe lying all in the southermost parts of
the town bounde of it bounded of the north as is given & described all the
upland of foureteene acres of the meadowe lyeth all together the
six acres of meadowe lying in Rudy meadowe. The upland lyeth
to the outside of the South lynd of the first five miles granted to
the town the east end of it is bounded by the west brooke, & runneth from
the South lynd northward till it cometh to a red oake about forty rods
from the upper end of the meadowe & then shooeth up about forty
rods northward to a straight small red oake being marked for the
corner tree & from thence runneth northward to a white oake marked
and from thence over the little brooke that runneth into the road of the
meadowe to a red oake marked about the work & then upon a straight
lynd to a white oake that answereth to the straight lynd of the
meadowe on the north east side of the meadowe we said upland
doth joyn to the meadowe to the South west & North west parts of
it, And the foureteene acres of meadowe extendeth itself from
the upland in the upper end of it all the whole piece of meadowe
for the allowance to the third division of meadowe. And the
six acres of meadowe lying in Rudy meadowe runneth all along
on the west side the meadowe & ytted from the meadowe by an
oak on the west side the meadowe & from the oak extendeth in breadth
to a pynd on the hill side & at the east end ytted by a marked
pynd from William warden meadowe & extendeth in breadth to a
small young oake upon a little fild of upland we said upland
& meadowe were laid out by the appointment of the town
by Edmund Goodenowes & Hugh Griffin forty acres of the said
upland was granted by the town to Thomas Westbrook And
all the twenty acres of meadowe was granted to the said
Thomas Westbrook for & in consideration of ten acres of meadowe
ten acres of the said upland was granted to him at the same time & now
the said upland was the third division of upland
belonging to William Parker & it parts of the land that William
Parker bought of him And the other one & twenty acres of upland
was the third division of upland granted to Thomas Brown.
