

Also two acres of meadows bordering upon the river lying in
the meadows between the meadows of Edmund Goodnowe & the
meadows granted to John Hudson now in the possession of
Josiah Saynt was an allowance to the said division of
meadows granted to Henry printed

Laid out unto Edward two five acres of meadows lying about
the Northam pond by the river beginning at the north of the
said camp a pine mark on the upland against the north of
the river & at the upper end marked by a white oak & from
thence to the river & by the west side of the river
& up to the river was five acres & part of upland and
of meadow was given to the Philomena whole.

granted to John Maynard four acres of upland lying upon the
playne beginning to the land formerly granted to Thomas Hyllyn
now in the possession of William Brown. & by the river to the land
of Robert Darrell being parts of John Maynard's second division
Also granted to John John Maynard three acres of meadow
lying in west meadows & by the river between the meadows of John
Goodnowe, and the meadows first granted to Mr. Houndam
now in the possession of Edmund Goodnowe. & by the north
side of the west brook from the brook to the upland.

On the day of April 1654 Laid out unto Thomas White three acres of
land lying at the North east end of the lands granted to John Butler for a house
situated from the field whereon John Ruddle's house stands by the said lands
of John Butler and three acres of upland is a part of the third division of
upland first due to John Butler & now belonging to the said Thomas White

John Ruddle hath bought a parcel of meadow
of the widow Georg of water house being by
the northern fence as there is a white pine fence
more or less which parcel of meadow lies in
the great piece of meadow between John and George
James and Symon the which was the second
division of William James the 34 lot
the 14th day of June 1654

Laid out by 3 of June 1660
from George Ruddle's house through the pine playne towards water house
through the lands of Henry Curtis on the river side of the said
of millbrook taking of a piece of the fourth parts of the lands of the
said Henry Curtis for the accommodating of the said highway and ending at
the river on the east side of the lands of Henry Curtis for satisfaction
of right was laid in the said way by us Edmund Goodnowe
and James and Symon Curtis.
