Dated and granted liberty the day and year above written to John Hains and Josiah Hains to lay down two twelve acres of land which was the land of m^r apthor moys lying and being on the spine of the river on the west side of the river above the madow of John Bount and also granted liberty to the sayd John Hains and Josiah Hains to take up if they see meet twelve acres of land beyond the gauntrey brooke going to the lands already layd out to John Hains Wiffenat Goodenow and John Bount and to Joyn with Thomas moys and to measure the sayd

twelve acres of land to them Also granted liberty the day and year above written to Thomas Ghynton to lay down six acres of land upon the afore sayd place to the town where sayd land so layd down was the land of m^r apthor moys and also granted liberty to the sayd Thomas Ghynton to take up six acres of land beyond the gauntrey near to his own madow or if the sayd Thomas Ghynton shall refuse to take the sayd six acres of land at the afore sayd place of gauntrey that then it shall be in the liberty of the sayd Thomas Ghynton to take the Community of four men chosen by us as namely Wiffenat Goodenow Joynat Grant Thomas moys and John Hains where and if they the sayd Community shall and can see meet that the sayd six acres of land may be layd out above his own ten acres of land already granted being no ways damageable to his ways neyther detourment to the inhabitants or any of them in the west side of the river in the turning out of their cattle the sayd Community having respect to the afore sayd premises of the sayd land

Also granted to John Hains the day and year above written two acres of land in lieu of a piece of madow in spine madow where the sayd John Hains layd down and assigned to the town of Sudbury where the making of a rutway over the northernmost string of spine madow the sayd madow is assigned to the town where was part of the third division of water hains and is about one acre being all the northernmost string of spine madow from the great river madow two rods westerly of the rutway formerly made with logs

76 Dated and granted in the town meeting the day and year above written that there shall be a sufficient rutway made over the two lower strings of spine madow near the great madow by the proprietors of madow that have madow in the north west or north east side beyond the sayd way proportionable to the madow they have beyond the sayd way whether at present they use the madows or not and if any refuse to make their proportionable part according to the quantity of acres of madow that at present they do possess in the north side of the sayd strings of spine madow that then it shall be lawfull for the sayd madow makers the sayd way to demand and receive thereunto alowed for every load of haywood or timber that is brought over the sayd way by the said four carrying it
