

for a piece of meadow at Gantrey two rods wide over against his meadow at 73
 the new cart bridge there, as also in consideration and full satisfaction of the
 fringe of meadow he layd down on the north side of the cart way made over
 his meadow at Gantrey using way leading into the north side of the quays and
 woods and meadow his by and with the consent of the said Thomas Plymton
 also let it be remembered that in the north west sit of the little meadow which
 the said Thomas Plymton hath taken up the line dividing his land and the highway
 way doth go over a little swampy place which is also swampy in the highway
 which place of swampy ground the said Thomas Plymton did engage for himself
 and his successors for ever to make and maintain what was needfull for the
 the highway his done before he cometh afore said

at a town meeting the day and year above written the Joseph Moxes is chosen
 to keep the new pound one year beginning the first of April next the which
 he hath accepted the Town ordering that he the said Joseph Moxes shall demand
 and receive four pence for every particular man's cart every time he
 is impounded,

Also granted liberty the day and year above written unto John Smith to lay down
 four acres and a halfe of land on the east side of Sudbury river being on the
 river plain and to take up four acres and a halfe on the west side of the
 river near unto town a new of upland already layd out unto him the said
 John Smith where it may not detriment eight ways without good reason
 the said land unto John Smith

Also granted liberty the day and year above written unto William Whittle to lay down
 four acres of land upon the river plain on the east side of the river and to take up
 four acres of land upon again in the land where John Smith layd down
 upon the plain on the east side of the river

Also granted liberty the day and year above written unto Jonathan Chapman
 to lay down four acres of upland on the river plain where the lands of the former
 and to take up ten acres of land again where he was so commonly
 on the east side of the river not considering former grants which yet doth
 eight ways provided he make return unto the next Town meeting the 10th day of
 it. Also granted unto Elias Rogers the day and year above written six acres of
 upland and four acres of meadow where it may be layd out not considering
 former grants which yet doth detriment eight ways, also granted unto Elias
 Rogers timber for his building and also timber and hoop poles for his sawing
 on of his woopers Trade the land meadow timber and poles for granted unto
 the said Elias Rogers is upon condition that he the said Elias Rogers shall dwell
 in Sudbury the six years next ensuing the said date and shall honestly and
 lawfully do the Town of Sudbury Copying works the said six years
 for making and trimming shingles at such honest rates as they are made
 and trim in the bay of Boston and if it shall happen that the said Elias Rogers
 shall either remove out of the Town or cease to carry on his Trade that
 then he shall surrender up his land and meadow to the Town of Sudbury
 again and be payd for his improvement of the same for what it doth
 when a new work that is to say for improvement
