

December 23 - 1664

At a generall Town meetinge the day and yeare above written Voted and concluded that the order in the town booke the forty. third page made the 26 of January. 1664 is respecting the takinge off the meetinge house that is to say the appointing of persons their seats in the meetinge house is againe ratified and confirmed

Also given and granted unto forgent John Grant the day and yeare above written six acres of upland in the west side of Sudbury river near the thirty acres of meadow formerly granted unto Ensign Thomas Capobon this sayd six acres of land he sayd forgent John Grant did accept in full satisfaction

At a town meetinge the 30th day of December 1664 forgent Josiah Gains is appointed by the town of Sudbury in the name of his father to give liberty to persons that have right to timber to cut and fall timber in the west side of Sudbury river Voted and concluded the day and yeare last above written at the sayd meetinge that the Town of Sudbury for future time will grant noe lands what soever within the town and bounds of Sudbury Except the maior part of those who have power to grant lands in the town of Sudbury doe affirmatively at the givinge and granting of the sayd lands

February the 28 - 1664

At a town meetinge the day and yeare above written Sergeant Goodenow and forgent Grant are chosen a committee to secure our right in the land at Bridell point now demanded by Mr Thomas Danforth agent to Governor William Esquire and next time or charges they the sayd Committee shall be bound in and about the prosecution of the business to assist the town to pay them
