at a town meeting the day and yeare above written the Town of Sudbury
gave exempted John Whit from payinge his present rate to the town and
also his present rate unto the minister, and this because of the poverty
of his family at present

Also Thomas Noyes Lieutenant Goodenow John Court senior Henry
viro Henry loker Thomas plyaton and peter Kinge are chosen sett
men for the yeare ensuinge to order the prudentiall affaires of the
town of Sudbury, Also peter Kinge was chosen Constable for
the yeare ensuinge, Also the day and yeare above written lieutenant
Goodenow Thomas Noyes and foryeut Giroud, are chosen

Comissioners to and small causes in Sudbury according to law
not exceeding forty shillings, Also the day and yeare above
written foryeut parmenter our town marshall made his account
with the town all the Town debts being payd and foryeut parmenter
debtor to the town one shillings eight pence

Also Thomas Noyes was chosen the day and yeare above written to be
Town clerk for the yeare ensuinge and foryeut to make
a town rate to pay the town debts also foryeut parmenter
is chosen marshall for this present rate to yaker, and is to be done
twenty shillings out of his present rate for the gettinge and

paying of the sayd rate also granted that m^r Hunt shall have
fifty shillings out of his present rate, also voted that none shall be
payd but also the pay for birds killed in his rate unless they be
shown to be good according to former order unto John blanford
John Hains or foryeut parmenter or either of them, and for time
to come none shall be payd for any birds unless they show to

be good of the birds killed unto the men appointed according to former
order Also the day and yeare above written amongst with our
deputy for this term in the generall court beinge now six weeks
in the yeare 1664 the sayd deputy maintaining himselfe at the generall
session of the sayd generall Court, allowing our deputy Thomas
Noyes twenty shillings so received of Thomas Trade as also the
rent so was to pay for the Common meadow so given, as also

the sayd Thomas Noyes to have all the Common meadow in
the Town of Sudbury and the meadow reserved for a minister
the yeare ensuinge and his wif & his consent to be his full satisfaction
Also the day and yeare above written the Town of Sudbury agreed
to give answer at the next meeting whether or now they will
accomodate in walter with any lands toward his improvement
to keep a free strolle in Sudbury.
