

February 21 - 1665

At a generall town meetinge the day and yeare above written voted and granted that the Town of Sudbury will give m^r Albrothophilian five bushells of wheate in consideration of his sume of the widdow Gunt some time past and this done by a free contribution of well affected persons who did at the sayd meetinge doe what their names to be giving and raising in of the sayd wheate unto the house of the Kings, the same to arrive againe in summe but not in kind where the next town rate is made

Also the day and yeare above written the King is chosen to gather the next town rate and with it to pay the town debts for which the town shal allow and grant him the sayd other Kings twellie years

Also voted the day and yeare above written and granted that the Town will pay the men who were employed in the serving down before althorpe a wandering vagrant person the buying of his winter

Also the day and yeare above written liffen and Goodenow forgot about what Thomas Doyce made their returne concerning what meadow was in the gullph meadow left, viz m^r Brown the pastor layd down. viz was upon exact measure found to be twenty four acres one rood and some odd rods. all of which found acres was layd out unto Thomas Plymton and Peter Kings, viz the sayd four acres was first layd unto Peter Kings and by him sold unto John Woods and by the sayd John Woods sold unto Thomas Plymton and Peter Kings and the sayd four acres of meadow lyatt together to the meadow viz John Woods sold to Thomas Plymton and Peter Kings the sayd four acres is marked on the east by a swamp oak on the upland and at the north east angle by a litle oak marked at the east end of the Island viz the Island being in the meadow this is returned the Town of Sudbury accepted and confirmed the meadow unto the sayd Thomas Plymton and Peter Kings the 21 of february 1665 the east line of the sayd four acres of meadow runneth from the swamp oak upon the upland unto the litle oak at the east end of the Island upon a north and by east point four degrees easterly
