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At a town meetinge the 21 day of february 1664

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lieutenant Goodenow Thomas noyes sergeant John Crowt Corporall Henry
Pierre m^r Joseph noyes John Abbot senior and Thomas Glynton were chosen
foresaid men to order the prudentiall affaires of the Town of Sudbury for
the yeare ensuing

Also the day and yeare last above written lieutenant Goodenow Thomas
noyes and sergeant grout were chosen Commissioners to hear issue and
end small causes in Sudbury according to law not exceeding forty shillings

Also the day and yeare last above written Thomas noyes and John Crowt
were chosen to take an tax for this present february for the pastors
rate and town rates and higg way rates and also to take an m^r work
in the month of august next for the Countrey, County, pastors and
Town rates

Also John Blanford was chosen Constable the day and yeare above written
for the yeare ensuing

Also m^r Joseph noyes and William moores were chosen surveyors the
day and yeare above written to survey, estimate and repayre all the
Countrey higg wayes in this our Town and bounds of Sudbury that
shall need repayre and amendment and the sayd surveyors are to
remain in their office untill they have wrought out a rate of
twenty pounds levied on the inhabitants according to an m^r work
of their officers this present february 1664 as also in case any
man or men neglect or refuse to worke their just proportion
on the higg wayes being lawfully warned thereto that then and by
the Town of Sudbury doe order the sayd surveyors to take the quantity
according to a former Town order february the 21. 1664

Also asompted and returned with our Deputy Thomas noyes for his next
workes forvis in the generall Court the last yeare by the sayd Thomas
noyes maintaining him selfe there as also for his slaves shipp in the
Town of Sudbury the last yeare as also in trustings and in anything
him the sayd Thomas noyes to buy and at his own charge to get
a sufficient good list of rullers for the use of the military company
of Sudbury for all wher forvis for Dorset and the sayd rullers for
provided to the Town of Sudbury have freely and joyntly and
with our consent given him the sayd Thomas noyes a certain parcel
of meadow lying and being on the west side of Sudbury near by
meadow bound by the name of Donfald meadow being
bounded by the sayd Donfald meadow on the north, west and the meadow
granted to sergeant grout on the south, westerly and also bounded
at the north east end by the meadow formerly granted unto
Captayne William goltham for his thirds division of meadow all the
above sayd meadow for bounded as is above expressed was granted the
sayd Thomas noyes in consideration above sayd, only one acre and halfe
of the above sayd only being due to him the sayd Thomas noyes
for what meadow he layed down to make the higg way convenient
unto the Countrey meadows,

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Also granted unto Jonathan Stennage the day and yeare above written
fifteen shillings in consideration of his services the meetinge goes
the last yeare

Also voted that m^r Hunt shall have fifty shillings out of a rate to be
made this present february 1665 his m^r request of the yeare
