

At a select men meeting the day, and yeare about written forgent Circuit
m^r Joseph noyes and Joseph Goodenow are chosen to draw the east line
of our bounds between wattertown and as when called by
wattertown men.

Also William moore Richard oward and John Butler senior are chosen to
day, and yeare about written to run the north line between Concord
and as this following spring when called by. Concord men
are in case of absence of either of them Joseph a mainer to supply
Also lieutenant Goodenow Corporall Henry, and Thomas noyes
are chosen to stand and well to bound and make the south, and
also the west line of our outlyde bounds this following summer
themselves to appoynt the best and most convenient time.

Also ordered the day and yeare about written the every housholder within
ladder order this our Town and bounds of Sudbury shall allways be provided and
have a sufficient good ladder at his dwelling house when may need
to the tops of his house for preservation of his house he payeth
of the forty shillings of ten shillings to the use of the Town of Sudbury
Jonathan Stanap is appoynted to see to the execution of his order
and to receive halfe the fines of ten shillings of every delinquent
yearly.

Also ordered the day, and yeare about written that all fences of
generall and particular some fields in this our Town and bounds
of Sudbury shall be well and sufficiently made up at or before
the first of apriill next ensuing this date it is first
leave it not then to be made up within ten dayes next after
the first of the sayd fences to be made up either with four rayles well
set (and good rayles) three fote and an halfe high or otherwise good
solid well staked and well cethered of the same height, or otherwise
fence as shall be equivalent with the above sayd four rayle fence
and whatsover fences neither generall or particular fences are not
well and sufficiently made up at or before the first day of apriill
next the owners of every such fence or fences shall forfeit ten shillings
yearly a rod to surveyors of the fence of but forth where it is
found defective over and above the making good any or all damages
sustayned by the insufficiency of the sayd fence.

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Also we the select men of Sudbury doo further order that all cattell of the sore
kind about one yeare old within this our town and bounds of Sudbury shall be guarded
and kept under the hand of a sufficient keeper or otherwise kept in their own
proprietie this following summer from the first of apriill next ensuing this
date unto the twenty first of october upon the penalty of paying of six pence
a beast every time for every beast that is too taken provided this order shall not
extend to oxen that are turned from work when they are known to be
officially guarded or kept under the hand of a sufficient keeper and also that his order
shall not extend unto cattell which are lost by the sportsman using cattell
are known to be constantly kept under the hand of a sufficient keeper.

Also it is further ordered that all swine about a month old within this our town and bounds
of Sudbury shall be well and sufficiently ringed at or before the first of apriill
next ensuing this date and so to remaine all the yeare after also it is further ordered
that all swine about one month old shall be well and sufficiently ringed at
or before the above sayd time and so to remaine untill the end of January
next and what swine is taken without a ring the owner shall forfeit
six pence at the first of apriill and the like penalty for want of a ring
the second time but not afterwards to be taken twice in one day Jonathan Stanap to be
