It is also ordered that on Monday the 25th instant ~~March~~ the
Inhabitants of this Town doo meet together at y^e Meeting house
about nine o'clock in y^e morning to bring in the Towns debts
credit, & to award y^e Suits to the labor of mens Estates & to award
this time y^e Suits unto them, & to lett out the Common Meadows
of this Town for y^e year ending:

It is ordered that the Common Meadows of this Town be lett out for y^e
year, & it is hereby accordingly done as followeth during

Common meadows lett
by this Town

And the Common Meadows above were lett out the 11th March 1677
as followeth:

Long meadow was lett out unto { Sir Blandford } for y^e year ending for 0: 7: 0
Greasy meadow

Ashon & Wang meadow on the 1st of the month was lett to Sir Josias Stangor for 0: 8: 0

John Goodenow gave six shillings for 2 pigswills (which was formerly lett to Sir Josias for 2: 0: 0)

Thomas Woodus is to retain the land in the meadow { which was sold him for
28 shillings the 1st of the month 1677

It is also ordered that the selected persons take care of the common meadows of
this Town that are not disposed as above for this year, & that they have power
to lett them out for this year at their discretion, & what person soever shall
presume to cut any common meadow of this Town without lett unto them
as above said, any other person who shall so do shall forfeit & pay unto
the use of this Town for every acre not lett unto them twoshillings sixpence
