At A meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town the 10th of July
1678: the day being before at a full meeting appointed to agitate
the mind weal was now done as followeth (vizt)

After every person at the full meeting and particularly declared save for
himself his own good liking vote of Mr. James & hermann, the ministry
for the further encouragement in order to the settlement in the Town
as Minister

granted 60. money
to be paid
for the dwelling house

It is unanimously voted, ordered, & concluded first that the Town shall
will give & pay unto the said Mr. James & hermann their Minister
dixty pounds in money: or sixty pounds and half in money &
the other half in country pay at country price, and half part of
is to be paid by the 25th of March 1679 the other half part by
the 25th of March 1680 & this is for the settlement of the said

60. of the annual salary

It is also the unanimous vote, ordered, & concluded in the 2^d place
that the Town shall will pay or raise to be paid unto the said
James & hermann Minister for his yearly maintenance
during his abode & residing in the Town, sixty pounds p. ann.
and quarter part thereof shall be paid in money, the second part
thereof shall be paid in wheat, pease, beef & mutton but the third
share, like at country price: the remaining half part of the aforesaid
sixty pounds shall be annually paid in unto the said, and half in Rye
the other in Indian corn & like at country price to begin the
1st of March 1678 & to end the 31st of August 1679

The agreement is of force till the 31st of August 1679 except the payment
in specie will be till the 31st August is not to be paid to be as above said yet
the proceeds to be paid in and a little allowed by the town made about the
30th of June called the 30th & the 30th fold: with 100 p. of the book

about the country Road

It is voted, ordered, & concluded that the Town shall be reason to attend the
business of the said highway And the Road or highway we have heard of
Marlborough would now have been laid out from the Town
to the Gravel pit at the western end of the great Cawsey of the Town:
in the side of Marlborough and so far to the west of the highway
from the said Gravel pit through Lancaster road & so directly to
the Town, as the old town of the Town did last week offer
the same to the Town's messengers but the said same offered about it
but will go to court to obtain the new way by the means, y^e
the Town and to impound the said messengers in behalf of the
Town to the utmost
And it is also ordered & concluded that the said Mr. Goodnow & the said Mr. Grouth
and the said Mr. Grouth as the Town shall be in behalf of the Town to
support a man that offered with the said of Marlborough & to impound the
said messengers, if they will needs go to court to have a new way laid out
