It is covenanted & boled. And to be Down sole freely Give & Grant
unto Mr. James Sherman Minister of the word of God all y^e House
& lands w^{ch} he & Down bought lately of John Lobbs, & Twenty
pounds to be made ym in Country Day towards the repair of the
the church: And also Twenty pounds more to be paid ym in money
for the towards the purchase of the widow Mary Lobbs Lot & all
lands adjoining to it, w^{ch} she shall good sold it to the said Mr. James
Sherman: And also six Acres of common upland lying on the
bar side of the Down at the end of Smiths field: And also six Acres
of meadow Ground some w^{ch} are out of the common meadows of
the Down: & also foregoing particular Gifts & Grants the said Down
sole, bought & promised the said Mr. James Sherman minister & his
heirs shall good for ever in case god shall so will in the Down
live & dyd amongst them their Descending Elders: But in case the
said Mr. Sherman shall not ^{carry on} the constant work of preaching amongst
them in the Down during his life, or shall depart the Down
before his death, Then all the promises shall return
into the said Downes hands again to be at their own dispose for
ever: only they are to pay to the said Mr. Sherman all the
charges the said Down out for the same in the mean time, as
they shall be judged worthy by indifferent men mutually chosen
unless both parties shall agree to some better condition.

It is also concluded & voted. And let sd. Town dole also farther
engage & promise annually to pay unto y^e sd. m^r James Shorman
weildest & continual labouring in y^e publick works of the
ministry, & constant accustomed preaching of the word of God
in the Town of Andbury & unto the people thereof Eighty pounds
in manner following (vizt) Twenty pounds of which shall be paid
him in money, & another Twenty pounds of which shall be paid
him in wedale, horse bodys mutton wool, butter or tadders or such
like exports at country price, And the remaining forty pounds
shall be paid him in Indian corn, Rye, or barley or wheat
all at country price, the payment of these eighty pounds y^e annu
is to begin to grow due on the first day of September 1679.
The one half part thereof is to be collected by a rate made
ending the last day of February 1679: the other half part by
a like rate made on the Inhabitants of the Town to due the
last day of August 1680, & so on wards every five months for
half year in like manner to be attended: And let sd. Town & L.
also grant y^t the sd. m^r James Shorman shall have five pounds
y^e annum added unto his salary of do^{ts} for the cutting & carting some
of the wood (vizt in the sd. Town) of firewood for the use fifty shill
thereof to be regarded upon every half year's rate affords, & is to
be paid him in country pay & at country price: And let sd. Town dole at
grant that the sd. m^r James Shorman shall during the time of his
publick preaching amongst them, have & enjoy the free use & benefit
all meadows within the Town that hath been formerly & is laid out for
