Wolde & ordred that not be foran or kept that is now left growing
on the common or eggway between Tolox Kings house & the town bridge
on penalty of paying ten shillings a head of oxen small of any person
shall feed on any way kept or kept without special & particular leave
or order from the town at a public town meeting: for that all heads
growing there are hereby ordered to be carefully preserved for shade
the Tolox King is hereby ordered & impowered to have especially care to see
his order be not broken in any kind by any person or persons whatsoever:
be it concluded by the town that they will pay no part money towards the
commutation, & that they will stand by & serve the Constables herein:

upon a motion made at the meeting of the town to have the lands on the north
of the town street between the church lotte, & the moor & the house of the church dwell
ings & lands about the church ordered to be better fenced ground for sheep Calverton. It
was ordered & voted that such as would break up any part of that common might
provided that what is ploughed or broken up should be sown with English grain & the
first four years for that end should enjoy it found towards successively, only
the fourth year it shall be sown with English grain & the
land given to the town by Henry the fourth of his part & so left to the town for the
towns use (small with the training place is excepted & not to be sown) & waste soil

forasmuch as the widow Mary Lober of the town refused to stand to the payment
