It is ordered of all Courts of Justice & particular Barn fields & Chesham within his Town and
limits & of the Bishop of Exeter & his successors shall be well & sufficiently mending
finished by the 1st of April next (excepted for the first year in which it is first done) & by and to
be mended & finished within the saids after at each year) & the said Courts are to be mended
dike with substantial Rosh walled & filled with four good broad & substantial rails so
about four to five feet & a calf's egg: or covered with a good close strong edge
substantially staked & well covered of the said egg: or any other good sufficient & substantial
four as shall be equivalent & every way as good & strong as y^e aforesaid Rosh & rail four.
And weal four are not well & sufficiently mended or closed on the 10th of April 1682 at
the latest to own: of such four or fours shall forfeit & pay 12 p. rod to the surveyor: &
y^e particular fours of that field or circuit are under named & shall also make good &
pay every call damages sustained by any for any man's default & in: w^{ch} four are
in this manner to be substantially & every way sufficiently kept up & maintained till
Indian year next to fully & duly on penalty of paying to the surveyor & damages aforesaid
for every default all along in the mean time.
