whereat Capt. Sam^l Goodenow was Esquire and Com^{rs} to join with y^e s^{aid} Justices of the
County Court in Aug^r. next to assess & rate y^e rates of men according to the sum of
y^e s^{aid} Estate now in duty to be labor according to the s^{aid} Estate. And y^e s^{aid} Justices
did order to be shewⁿ down on the 1st day of y^e next next to be examined & fully
