town or sure man as here hired them twelve pence per load
for every load that they shall cut.

Voted the day and year above written that the town will give
twenty shillings a year for every self that shall be killed
both long and old with in the bounds of Sudbury to sure
men or persons as shall be all the labor and pains
to kill them

Voted by the town that the Clerk doe enter the five

his land in the town Books buttled and bounded as Deacon In Hamd
to be returned and Quett John Goodenow did present it to the town

John Goodenow and Saml poster Noyes desired and requested
to change land with the town the town were pleased so
far to answer there Request that by a lres vote they
chose a Cominty and appointed Deacon John Haines Moderator and
Edward Wright to inspect and view the land that the
Goodenow and Noyes would lay down and after take up
land in town lot and make report to the town of the same at their
next meeting
