

Sudbury September 4th 1689 voted that our pastor Ralph 3

January 20 89 at a meeting of y^e select men it was voted by y^e
major part that the Trowers should be left out of the Country

Sudbury 1689 a towns meeting legally warned for the Inhabitants to meet
Feb 23rd 1689 being a meeting to hear the Inverne of mens estate under which thing being deliberated
the town voted and agreed that by that Inverne the pastor rate should be
forth with made and delivered into him

Mr James Sherman's rate due beginning first of September in 89 and
ending in Feb 89 was by the select men pd to him the third of March 1689

town in April y^e first: 1690 at a select mens meeting it was voted and
determined that shall goe to y^e respective inhabitants in their severall
Quartars who have received the publick stock of ammunition
and make examination whole they have it whole in their
hands if it be it is theore to remain till further order
be taken but if it be diminished they are to require and
receive twelve pence for every pound of powder that is wanting
and so proportionable for lesser Quantities

they voted and ordered that all swine of about a month old in
and about our town of Sudbury be from the first of the next
April sufficient and strongly ringed in the midst of the snout
and every swine yoked with a good and substantiall yoke
the bridg to be as long as the swine standing upon his four
feet is by the watch or six pence to goe 3 or 4 miles before
the bottom of the bridg and 3 or 6 miles above his nose
and what so ever swine shall be taken unyoked through out your
year the owner of such swine shall pay six pence at one for every
defect provided the forfeiter shall be taken but once in a day
and every swine that shall be taken unyoked as aforesaid from y^e 1st
of April to the middle of October the owner of such swine shall
pay 6 pence apiece for all such swine the forfeit shall not be
taken more then once in a day and once per month and the Rector
and are chosen and appointed to be overseers of swine on the east side
of River and Benj Moore & Edmond Goodenow to be overseers
of swine on all the west side of the river and may if they see
cause cause each of them have as good power and authority on
other side as they have on this side in taking of the penalty
or any other proper may take the fine if need require

they voted and determined that all fowls in and about this our town
be forth with made up sufficient whether the Governor or particular
fowls and what so ever fowls shall be found unmade up or
insufficiently made up after the tenth of this instant April the owner
of such fowls shall pay 12 pence for every one of such fowls
found unmade up or insufficiently made up
