 the said Peter King and Thomas Plimpton do
 hereby bind the seats in the new meeting house
 are for to be built in the same form that the
 were in the old meeting house the seats are to be an
 gutter then they were in the old house; they are to
 have seats in the middle front house and six seats at
 and they are for to make them of sufficient timber
 for to put in the boards of either oak or for
 larch and varnish and boards of oak; when made
 for are to finish by the middle of may next for and
 make the ground most fit for the rest of the seats

the select men do promise for to pay for or
 for one sitting eight pence a seat; when they it
 be paid the one half in negotiable or by other ways
 when they are to receive when due after the
 is finished; if they do finish the work sooner
 time they are to pay within a week after the time that
 the work is done; and they are to have all the pay brought
 to the select men's house; and they are to give for what they
 at the abridgement of the year at 30 6d a year
