 February Inhabitants to bring in an answer of theor 2dly fairly written and
 1693 meeting house which was by the most pt of the town attended and
 the work proceeded comfortably it was then voted by the town the

 men proffered should bee the way betwixt theor town and marlbrough
 and upon the best Observation was could make we find the way with
 Sudbury men showed though it may bee three quarters of a mile y^e
 Longest to be far y^e more Eligible and by much y^e most safe way
 for travell and is not likely to cost the town of Sudbury much to make
 it safely passable whar ad y^e way the marlbrough men desired though it
 should be granted thorow that pt of the woods wher the marlbrough
 men led is about two miles out of the usual road from Peter Norton
 mill to marlbrough will cost the town of Sudbury not much less than
 a hundred pounds and therefore we doe according to our best understanding
 make our return that the way showed by the Sudbury men should be
 the way betwixt the towns of Sudbury and marlbrough and it is their desire
 bee first to begin at the Cravell Pitt at y^e Gasway end over Sudbury
 meadow and so to go along the boaton Road leading to ripton Goodman
 untill it come to Sarjant Wrights and then to turn by Jabez Browns
 corner and so pass over the north end of goodmans Hill and so to go on the
 west side of goodmans Hill untill it come to y^e Road laid out from
 Sudbury to Lanchester keeping y^e said Road untill they come to the place
 turning from thence to marlbrough which lyes on Colo Holo plain and
 was formerly the Road the marlbrough men did chuse as we were
 informed and so to keep the said path to marlbrough which enters
 the town of marlbrough by Obadiah wards house
