 unto the persons before named to erect and make a fence from a ditch
 in the Great river meadow over thwarte unork of land wher
 belongeth to the town of Sudbury unto the year end of the meadow of
 mr peter King called the Gulph meadow the fence is to bee shutt
 up by the beginning of may and layd open by the latter end of august
 annually for good food of Cretures
 the town have exchanged a pece of land with John wooder said wooder is to take
 a pece of mead or swampy land all the lower end of Sert Jonathan Stanhope
 near rastle hills and the said wooder is to lay down and wright for
 the towne a yf fiver and in the end of four or according to that rule
 voted that the town sell unto Joseph Curtiss a pece of land lying before his
 new dwelling house and have not exceeding an acre and half after the price
 twenty shillings in money pay arer
