

Sudbury November ye 26: 1694 Being a town meeting legally warned  
 Mr. Peter King list Edward Wright & Saml Bonj moor or any two  
 of them as a committee chosen by the town to view a poor of land &  
 Joseph noyes junr would lay down in one place and take up in another  
 and make report unto the town: of the land at the next meeting  
 Sert James Barnard is chosen by the town to wait on the town  
 of quarter sessions: next holden at Chelmsford to manage  
 in the towns behalf as to prevent the having a highway throug  
 our town by George perminthall: if it may be helped.

Sudbury December the 3<sup>rd</sup> at a select mens meeting Constable  
 Stanhop appeared and made up his accounts of his part of ye money  
 rate that was made for them blak as followeth paid to our  
 twaga Mr Joseph noyes: five poud 12 s 9 d — 5 — 12 — 9  
 more six shill for robbing 3 shill to wd. bent 6 poud to Mr. Walter  
 6 poud to Capt moor 6 poud to Mr. Hunt in all to 10 — 26  
 the day & year above written Benjamin Wright appeared before us  
 and made up his accounts: and have paid to our twaga  
 Mr Joseph noyes: three poud 7 s — 03 — 07 — 00  
 at a town meeting of 17 of December appeared and made up  
 his accounts with ye town about blak into  
 dated for robbing by Constable Wright  
 by eight shillings: to Saml Wright for tithes } — 0 — 8 — 0

At a town meeting the day above written it was voted ordered and determined: that ye  
 Select men of this town should assess the Inhabitants of this town to a money  
 rate of eight pound or thereabouts for ye payment of ye towns  
 representatives for the service at the Conneall assembly  
 Voted and determined that the Constable of this town shall have  
 six poud in the pound for gathering all towns rates that shall  
 be committed to them by the Select men

This day Sert Barnard made report to the town what success he  
 mett with all the quarter sessions: and then did these a committee  
 to meet with and treat the Jury that shall be appointed to state  
 ye matter by way bookson our town and Malbrough and Indover  
 to the utmost of their power that it may be layd out so as it  
 may be lost perdoginall to our town  
 the Committee chosen were to wit —  
 then voted that ye town did consent to ye way  
 of Jos noyes junr as to his exchange of a small  
 poor of Swamp Ground and did order that the  
 town should shod stat both the one and the other

And 9<sup>th</sup> at a select mens meeting the 22: of february 1694  
 Josop Chamberlin pay into the Select men of Sudbury  
 four pound of current money of new england which he was  
 indebted to the town for five acres of land sad Chamberlin  
 bought of the town of Sudbury
